## **Proposed Constitutional Amendments To Be Explained by Rep. Vicki Truitt at Town Hall Meeting**

*Southlake (TX)* – State Representative Vicki Truitt (R-Keller) will be hosting a town hall meeting to explain the proposed constitutional amendments, which will be on the ballot during the November 8 election.

"There are ten propositions on the ballot this November to amend the Texas Constitution addressing issues ranging from homestead exemptions to water stewardship," explained Representative Truitt. "I want to make information available to my constituents that will help them understand the background, as well as the perspectives of both proponents and opponents, in order for them to make an independent and informed vote." She continued, "The purpose is not for me to suggest how they should vote, but to arm them with information that will enable them to choose how they wish to vote."
